

Coronavirus Update - 23.08.21

Kia ora koutou

The Prime Minister this afternoon has confirmed that New Zealand will remain at Alert Level 4 until 11.59pm Friday 27th August.

We will continue to offer our Distance Learning Programme from Preschool to Year 8, including the Arrowsmith Programme, until the end of this Friday, when the alert level is reviewed next. We will continue to keep families updated as events unfold and decisions are made.

Programme for Year 0-8

This week, your child's homeroom teacher will continue to post their daily timetable to Seesaw by 6.00pm the night before. There will be a scheduled specialist teacher class each day at the same time across the week. In your child's timetable will be the codes your child will need to log into each Google Meet along with their tasks or activities for the day. Your child will continue to have daily check-ins with their homeroom teacher at 9.00am and 2.30pm each day. The Distance Learning Programme is designed to be flexible and work around your family, so please do what you can and let your child's homeroom teacher know if you need support.

Programme for Preschool

All group/profile teachers will be meeting their groups online at 10:00am. Preschool families will receive a daily timetable with a Google Meet link from your child's group/profile teacher at 9:00am via Seesaw. The timetable will give you a run down of the scheduled play-based learning activities for the day and planned times for Google Meets.

Assistance with Technology

A reminder that if your child has any issues with their device or their software during our Distance Learning programme, please contact your classroom teacher. We are here to assist at all times.

Level 3 Planning and Preparation

In the event of a move to Level 3 in Wellington after this Friday, Preschool and School would reopen for students needing to be physically on site. If your child would need to return to school under Level 3, please complete this form. Thank you to the families that require their children to attend school and have completed this form. We greatly appreciate this and it assists us in providing the levels of staffing needed under Level 3.

Playgrounds Closed

A friendly reminder that the St Mark's School and Preschool playgrounds and grounds remain closed at Alert Level 4. Families should not be accessing any school grounds in the suburbs that you live in as well.

We know that this is a difficult and stressful time for you all and we are here, as a School, Preschool and as a Board, to help families of St Mark's.
